

Help with Indicator 13

This document is intended to provide insight on how the WAYPOINT program offered by TAI helps address the requirements of Indicator 13. All states in the U.S. have a Special Education state performance plan with 20 specific indicators. These indicators are benchmarks for the states. Indicator 13 represents eight questions regarding secondary transition within the IEP.

Indicator 13 Questions	WAYPOINT Help with Indicator 13
1. Is there an appropriate measurable postsecondary goal or goals that covers education or training, employment, and, as needed, independent living?	The WayPoint system is designed to assess functional aptitudes, interest and personality. The assessment results are used to identify career pathways and specific jobs the student has demonstrated the aptitude to handle. The assessments flow into the WayPoint career management system that provides job availability in the student's local zip code area, pay rates, along with postsecondary training requirements and facilities.
2. Is (are) the postsecondary goal(s) updated annually?	The WayPoint System provides built in, customizable annual checklists that track the student's performance as they move from school to post-school.
3. Is there evidence that the measurable postsecondary goal(s) were based on age appropriate transition assessment?	The assessment tools used in the WayPoint System are fully research-based and designed to be used with students from middle school to adulthood.
4. Are there transition services in the IEP that will reasonably enable the student to meet his or her postsecondary goal(s)?	The assessment tools in the WayPoint System provide the data required to develop annual IEP goals. The tracking (Planner) system included with Waypoint enables the student, teacher, and parents to follow and develop a career plan that will encourage the students to meet the goals. This system works with both self-contained and resource students that are being mainstreamed.

Indicator 13 Questions	WAYPOINT Help with Indicator 13
5. Do the transition services include courses of study that will reasonably enable the student to meet his or her postsecondary goal(s)?	The WayPoint System allows the district to put into place an academic plan and track the student's performance as they move from school to post-school. The assessment tools provide the data needed to determine where focused effort is needed to help the student develop the skills they need to function independently.
6. Is (are) there annual IEP goal(s) related to the student's transition services needs.	WayPoint allows the framework and document storage to house student's IEP goals.
7. Is there evidence that the student was invited to the IEP Team meeting where transition services were discussed?	The WayPoint System provides a computerized planner that can be customized to meet the specific requirements of the district. It can record and track all activities required for the student, including those stated in question #7. Records and documents can be electronically attached to the student's individual record for document verification of any activity.
8. If appropriate, is there evidence that a representative of any participating agency was invited to the IEP Team meeting with the prior consent of the parent or student who has reached the age of majority?	WayPoint allows the framework and document storage to house student's IEP meeting documents.
