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TRANSITION CHECKLISTS

Age 15 Transition Services Requirement Checklist

The jobs listed in this report are suggestions that Educators, Special Education Professionals, and Job Developers can use in helping to provide meaningful Transition to Employment. The jobs listed are from the D.O.L., US Department of Labor (DOL), and provide detailed information about requirements and job duties. Work Development Assessments, report general areas of skills and interest. Combining these Assessments with the WayPoint gives suggestions for jobs and local employers. These jobs are not guaranteed to be available but match with DOL Profiles and Data. Information is given in order to aid the career development of your students or clients. Job Developers are supplied with this information to seek out additional possible jobs and employers for their students or clients.

Age 15 (9th Grade) Transition Services Requirements Checklist

- Review the previous IEP.
- Provide notice to parent of the IEP meeting.
Indicate that the student will be invited to attend and the purpose of the meeting will be identifying transition services needs of the student.
- Invite the student to his/her IEP meeting.
- Document steps taken to ensure that the student's strengths, preferences, and interests were considered.
If student does not attend, document other steps taken to ensure his/her strengths, preferences and interests were considered.
- Update the statement of whether the student is pursuing a course of study.
Is the students pursuing a course of study leading to a standard or special diploma?
- Continue the process of identifying transition services for student.
Include the need for instruction to assist the student to become a self-advocate beginning at age 14 and in place by age 16.
- Review and if needed revise the diploma decision.
- Invite a representative of any agency providing or likely to provide transition services to student.
Permission from parents or student who has reached majority required.
- Reconvene the IEP team to identify alternative strategies.
Identify alternative strategies if an agency fails to provide services as indicated on the IEP.

Age 16 Transition Services Requirement Checklist

Age 16 (10th Grade) Transition Services Requirements Checklist

- Review the previous IEP.
- Provide notice to parent of IEP meeting.
The purpose of the meeting is the consideration of postsecondary goals & transition services for student. Student will be invited to attend. Identify any other agency invited.
- Invite the student to his/her IEP meeting.
- Invite a representative of any agency.
This is for any agency providing or likely to provide transition services to student. Permission from parents or student who has reached majority required.
- Document steps taken to ensure that the student's strengths, preferences, and interests were considered.
If student does not attend, document other steps taken to ensure his/her strengths, preferences and interests were considered.
- Update the statement of whether the student is pursuing a specific diploma course.
A course of study should lead to a standard or special diploma.
- Review and if needed revise the diploma decision.
- Document consideration of the student's specific needs.
Student's need for instruction or provision of information in the area of self-determination to assist the student to actively and effectively participate in IEP meetings and self-advocate should be noted.
- Develop measurable postsecondary goals based on age-appropriate transition assessment.
Age-appropriate transition assessment include areas of education, training, employment, and independent living. (where appropriate)
- Ensure measurable postsecondary goals are based on age-appropriate transition assessment.
This may be reflected in present levels of academic achievement and functional performance or the summary of assessment/evaluation data.
- Develop services in each of the needed areas that focus on improving academic functional achievement.
This may include instruction, community experiences, employment, post-school adult living, daily living skills and functional vocational evaluation.
- Develop annual IEP goals related to student's transition services needs.
- Reconvene the IEP team to identify alternative strategies.
These are specific strategies to help meet the students transition objectives if an agency fails to provide transition services described in IEP.
- Develop a "no services needed statement".
The statement describes when no transition services are needed in any of the transition services activity areas.

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Describe basis upon which a determination was made.

These determinations are made if no services are needed in one or more of the transition services areas (i.e. instruction, community experiences, employment and post-school adult living, daily living skills etc.)

Identify an IEP team member or designee to follow-up with agencies to ensure that services are provided.
